When healthcare systems around the world were caught scrambling to respond in the early days of the pandemic, Black Creek CHC's care team hit the ground running.

We responded immediately, with efficiency and effectiveness to successfully deliver culturally appropriate and accessible care to everyone living in what came to be known as, one of the province's 'COVID hot spots.'

As a trusted provider of care, programs and services for more than three decades, Black Creek CHC anticipated the devastating impact COVID-19 would have in the community, where systemic barriers, along with pre-existing and chronic conditions, increase the risk of infection, serious illness, and

Looking beyond medical interventions to prevent infection with the COVID-19 virus, we highlighted the direct link between infection risk and socio-economic factors such as financial wellbeing. affordable housing, and food security.

Our continuing focus on upstream approaches to reduce the risk of downstream health issues proved to be the right path for our care team, clients, and community.

The essence of Black Creek CHC's comprehensive and integrated approach was exemplified in the recruitment and deputization of long-time residents as Community Ambassadors, whose work is credited for leveraging the community's trust, to improve vaccine coverage in Northwest Toronto.

In 2021-2022, Black Creek CHC participated in the delivery of more than one-hundred-thousand first, second and booster vaccine doses, in partnership with community groups, faith groups, healthcare providers and social service agencies.

These innovative collaborations captured media attention and the acknowledgement of policymakers. resulting in additional funding allocated to Black Creek CHC as part of Ontario Health's High Priority Communities strategy.

While we had their attention, we felt compelled to amplify the message we heard from clients and community residents-that this is the 'care we deserve'.

This year, we also initiated the development of Black Creek CHC's 2022-27 strategic plan. Lessons learned throughout the pandemic have set the stage for the thoughtful and careful engagement that will inform the work we will do and how we will do it, over the next five years.

As we close another year like no other in our history, we are indebted to our dedicated staff team, volunteers and students for the compassionate delivery of care to our clients and the community. Support from our partners and funders was invaluable in helping us expand the reach of our services within the Humber-Black Creek and greater Northwest Toronto community.

Today and always, we remain committed to meeting clients where they are at, to amplify the call for the 'care we deserve' on behalf of a community that has entrusted us with their care.



When her mother reminded her, she'd be getting her COVID-19 vaccine with her friends at school, Sahara wanted to be brave, and to assure her mom she wouldn't cry. The truth is she was scared.

Even though her teacher explained what the vaccine does and how it helps protect her grandma and grandpa, from getting sick when they play with her and her brother, Nile, her tummy hurt a bit when she thought about getting a needle.

Sahara was so relieved when her class was greeted at gym doors by an older lady wearing a Black Creek Community Health Centre tee shirt with colourful writing on it. Her deep voice, and even her head wrap, reminded Sahara of her own grandmother.

Even though she couldn't see the nice lady's smile behind the mask, she could see her eyes were smiling. They walked her over to the nurse and the nice lady stayed with Sahara while she got her vaccine. Sahara says it didn't even hurt, and that she thinks it's because community ambassadors like Ms. Erma made her feel comfortable and safe.

Erma Broomes is a retired Personal Service Worker. She is one of the Community Ambassadors whose reach into the community supported outreach efforts, making trustworthy care and reliable information accessible.

Even at 6 years of age, Sahara understands, this is the "care we deserve". We hear Sahara and we're making sure others hear her too.
